To safely navigate the challenges of summer driving in an HGV, focus on staying cool, hydrated, and alert!

Prioritise route planning to avoid extreme heat and congestion, and ensure your vehicle is well-maintained, especially the air conditioning and cooling systems.

Staying Cool and Hydrated:

Hydration is Key: Drink plenty of water throughout the day, even if you don't feel thirsty, to prevent dehydration and maintain focus.

Utilize Air Conditioning: If your HGV has air conditioning, use it wisely, but avoid setting it to extreme temperatures to conserve fuel and prevent engine strain.

Sunshades and Ventilation:

Use sunshades to block direct sunlight and keep the cab cooler. Open windows for ventilation, but be mindful of wind noise and dust

Dress Appropriately: Wear light-colored, loose-fitting clothing made of breathable fabrics to help regulate body temperature.

Rest Breaks: Take regular rest breaks in shaded areas or use reflective screens to cool down during breaks.

Vehicle Maintenance and Safety:

Vehicle Checks: Ensure your vehicle is well-maintained, especially the air conditioning and cooling systems.

Tyre Pressure: Check tyre pressure regularly, as it can be affected by heat. **Glare Protection:** Use sunglasses

Glare Protection: Use sunglasses and sun visors to reduce glare and improve visibility.

Additional Tips:

Route Planning: Plan routes to avoid peak heat times and congested areas.

Stay Informed: Monitor weather conditions and be prepared for sudden changes.

Avoid Driving During Peak Heat: If possible, avoid driving during the hottest part of the day (typically between noon and 6 pm).
